Justin Nobel Book Signing and Discussion



PSR PA recently hosted the Philadelphia launch and discussion of science journalist Justin Nobel's new book Petroleum-238 at The Wooden Shoe, a local bookstore. Petroleum-238 reveals the story of a radioactive waste crisis caused by the fossil fuel industry. PSR PA Executive Director Tonyehn Verkitus moderated the discussion, which also featured former Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection press secretary Jamar Thrasher.

Nobel told the crowd that the fossil fuel industry knowingly creates millions of gallons of radioactive waste every year - enough barrels to go to the moon and back 28 times - but wants to avoid the high expense of proper disposal. Instead, companies employ vulnerable recent ex-inmates and drug users to do clean up. These workers, who are exposed to radiation levels hundreds and sometimes thousands of times higher than levels accepted by the Environmental Protection Agency, are not told that the sludge covering their clothes and boots is radioactive.

Poisoned While Playing Artificial Turf Fact Sheet

FDR Park in South Philadelphia is undergoing a multi-year, multi-phase, \$250+ million redesign. As part of this plan, athletic fields for youth and adults are proposed. Unfortunately, the proposed plan wants to use artificial (synthetic) and or allegedly turf free of "forever chemicals" instead of natural grass, creating a significant health hazard to the youth and adults that use the fields, to the people who maintain these fields, to the community and ultimately all Philadelphians. We oppose the use of artificial turf for these fields because of their health hazards and request a revision to the plan that only natural grass playing fields be installed.

What is artificial turf?

Artificial turf is a synthetic product that is manufactured commercially in a variety of different ways. Depending on the industry the turf will contain plastic (nylon, polypropylene, or polyethylene), infill made from recycled tires ("crumb rubber") or similar untested plastic materials; a drainage layer; and other padding layers. It degrades over time needing replacement periodically and will need to be disposed of at the end of its life. The "recycling" of synthetic turf has been shown to be problematic due to a myriad of hazardous chemicals often exceeding the established limits. The European Union has taken substantial steps to limit the fields' chemical components to which the public and environment are exposed.

Call Your State Reps: "Tell the PUC: PECO Needs More Solar In Its Default Service Plan"

Context: PSR PA is one of six organizations legally intervening in the process by which PECO's default service from 2025-2029 gets approved by the Pennsylvania Utility Commission. The plan for procurement that they have put forward has only 0.5% of its energy coming from solar energy, which is what their current plan is and the state legal minimum. With POWER, Clean Air Council, Vote Solar, Sierra Club, and PennEnvironment, we have filed testimony in opposition of their plan, underscoring that we need affordable energy that responds to the immediacy of our climate crisis.

Instructions:

- 1. Find your state reps here and then call the office number listed when you click on their name.
- 2. State your name, that you are a constituent, and that .5% is too little solar for PECO to be procuring for its default service from 2025-2029.
- 3. Recommend that your state rep write a letter expressing their support for increased renewable procurement in the Default Service Program to the Pennsylvania Utility Commission that can be filed on PECO's DSP Petition (which is Docket No. P-2024-3046008).
- 4. Say "Thank you" and hang up. Let us know that you took action!

THE GLOBAL CLIMATE & HEALTH

What is the World Health Assembly (WHA)?

WHA is the annual meeting of the world's ministries of health, hosted and convened by the World Health Organization to set global health policy.

Delegates make decisions on health targets, financing and strategies that will guide their own public health work.

As the <u>World Health Assembly</u> (WHA 77, May 27-June 1) opened in Geneva, the Global Climate and Health Alliance called on World Health Organization (WHO) member states to adopt a <u>proposed resolution on Climate Change and Health</u>. The <u>draft resolution</u> clearly states that climate change is a major threat to global public health, and sets out a framework to promote health and build climate-resilient and sustainable health systems [1]. The key global health meeting takes place just ahead of next month's <u>UN technical negotiations on climate in Bonn</u> (SB 60).
